In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Goa hereby makes the following rules to regulate the recruitment to the Group 'D', Non Ministerial, Non-Gazetted post in the Office of the Directorate of Mines and Geology, Government of Goa, namely:—

1. *Short title, application and commencement.*— (1) These rules may be called the Government of Goa, Office of the Directorate of Mines and Geology, Panaji, Group 'D', Non-Ministerial, Non-Gazetted post, Recruitment Rules, 2007.

(2) They shall apply to the post specified in column (1) of the Schedule to these rules (hereinafter called as the "said Schedule").

(3) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. *Number, classification and scale of pay.*— The number of posts, classification of the said post and the scale of pay attached thereto shall be as specified in columns (2) to (4) of the said Schedule:

Provided that the Government may vary the number of posts specified in column (2) of

the said Schedule from time to time subject to exigencies of work.

3. *Method of recruitment, age limit and other qualifications.*— The method of recruitment to the said post, age limit, qualifications and other matters connected therewith shall be as specified in columns (5) to (13) of the said Schedule.

4. *Disqualification.*— No person who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living or who, having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person, shall be eligible for appointment to the service:

Provided that the Government may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage and that there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

5. *Power to relax.*— Where the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may, by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

6. *Saving.*— Nothing in these rules shall affect reservations, relaxation of age limit and other concessions required to be provided for Scheduled Castes, and other special categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the Government from time to time in that regard.

Government is hereby pleased to introduce the "Tribals Development Plan", a scheme with an objective for upliftment of all the Tribals households staying in the State of Goa.

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (i) This scheme shall be called the "Tribals Development Plan – 2006".

(ii) It shall come into force at once.

2. *Objectives.*— The objective of the scheme is for upliftment of all the Tribals families in the State of Goa. It is estimated that in the State of Goa, there are about 35798 households as per survey conducted in the year 2003 who are still living in dense forests/remote areas and financially in poor conditions.

To achieve the goal, following fields are targeted:—

(i) To provide assistance for income generating family oriented schemes.

(ii) To provide infrastructure support by-community based infrastructure i.e. Aganwadi, Community hall, Bus shelters, Roads, Schools, Hospitals.

(iii) To provide irrigation facilities.

3. *Definition of tribal families.*— Tribal families as notified by the Government of India are Gawdas, Velips & Kunbis.

4. *Target Group.*— All the Tribal families of the State of Goa are targeted under this scheme whose income is less than Rs. 1.20 lakhs per annum.

5. *Status.*— The programme will be implemented under the Special Central Assistance provided by the Government of India & Grant under first proviso to Article 275 (1) of the Constitution of India.

6. *S.T. populations and its distribution in the State.*— As per the survey conducted by the Goa

State Commission for Backward Classes in the year 2003 total tribal population of the State are 162056, which is 12.02 % of the State population. The taluka-wise population is as follow:—

7. *Provide the assistance for livelihood through self employment & employment generation project (SCA to TSP).*—

Classification of the household:—

The families are divided in three groups as below:—

(i) The families whose names are enrolled in the BPL List;

(ii) The families whose name are not figuring in the BPL list but there income is less than Rs. 1.20 lakhs per annum; and

(iii) The families whose income is more than Rs. 1.20 lakhs per annum under the present scheme, financial assistance will be provided to the families mentioned at Sr. No. (i) & (ii) only.

Goa being a tourist destination and having bright future in transport field and small business stall, on tourist spots an other places, following activities are found suitable for economic upliftment of the tribes:—

(a) *Transport.*— the scheme is divided in three parts i.e.

(a) Subsidy for purchase of Motor Cycle (pilot)

(b) Purchase of tourist taxi

(c) Motor driving training [light & heavy vehicles].

Assistance in the above sector will be provided as below:—

The households whose names are enrolled in BPL list are entitled to take assistance under S.G.S.Y. scheme (A scheme of Government of India for self-employment) to start self-employment, through the District Rural Development Agencies (DRDA). As per the SGSY scheme maximum subsidy is 50% of project cost, subject to Rs. 10000/- per family. The beneficiaries applying for the project (a) & (b), will be provided an additional subsidy amount of Rs. 15,000/- (Rupees

fifteen thousand) under the present scheme. Hence the families whose names are enrolled in BPL list will be getting subsidy of Rs. 25,000/- (Rs. 10000/- from DRDA+15000/- from DSW) and the beneficiaries whose names are not recorded in the BPL list they will get subsidy of Rs. 15000/- only. In respect of project (c) cost of the training will be provided by the Government. It is targeted that about 650 persons who will be provided assistance in a financial year as per table below:—

(b) *Tea/Coffee & Coconut parlor*.— Goa is having a number of tourist places. Better quality mechanized Tea & Coffee shops attract tourists, as it is more hygienic than other restaurants. Similarly, tender coconut water is another attraction for the tourist. The State Government has already approved a scheme to provide place in the Government office complexes for tea/coffee machine. Keeping the requirements of tea and coffee machines and coconut parlor, the scheme is proposed. Cost of this project is about Rs. 25,000/- to 30,000/-. It is proposed that the entire project will be financed under the scheme. However, to make the project viable and to give responsibility to the beneficiaries that the project is not given free of cost, it is proposed that we may ask the beneficiaries to deposit 50% project cost within a period of 3 years. As stated in foregoing Para, initially the entire amount will be funded by the State Government. However, to encourage the beneficiaries and to make the project sustainable, the beneficiary has to deposit 50% of total cost in 36 installments to the

Department. The beneficiaries who deposit the aforesaid amount will be rewarded with the entire amount. In case the beneficiaries fails to deposit the amount/installments in time for three consecutive months or defaults for more than 3 times, his right to ownership will be suspended till he pays the entire amount. In case, he fails to repay the amount for six months, the same will be forfeited in favour of the Government. It is estimated that about 275 households will be benefited under this scheme. Hence total financial outlay required is 25000x275=Rs.68,75,000.

8. *Minor Irrigation*.— An amount of Rs. 31.88 lakhs is proposed to be spent on minor irrigation projects in the year 2006-07 as shown in the **Annexure-II**. The project estimates for subsequent years will be submitted separately.

9. *Infrastructure Development*.— Pre-school education plays an important role in the upliftment of families. The area under the clusters are not having Aganwadi infrastructure and are running in unhygienic environment in rented premises. Hence, it is proposed to construct ten Anganwadis in clusters and Quepem Taluka in the year 2006-07. The estimated cost of one Aganwadi is Rs. 3.42 lakhs (Model Estimate is at **Annexure-III**). Hence, Rs. 34.20 lakhs are required.
