Whereas, the Recruitment Rules for the post in the Cadre of Assistant Director of Civil Supplies (hereinafter called "the said Cadre") provides a period of two years as probation period for the officers in the Cadre;

And whereas, the said Recruitment Rules provide that the officers in the said Cadre, whether promotees or direct recruits shall be required to pass the Departmental examination during the said probation period so as to ensure that they have basic knowledge of certain subjects for efficient discharge of their official duties.

Now, therefore, the Government of Goa is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

1. *Short title, applicability and commencement.*— (1) These rules may be called the Goa Departmental Examination for the officers in the cadre of Assistant Director of Civil Supplies Rules, 2023.

(2) They shall apply to all officers on probation, whether promotees or direct recruits in the cadre of Assistant Director of Civil Supplies.

(3) They shall come into force at once.

2. *Examination Programme.*— (1) The examination shall be held every six months.

(2) The date of examination shall be notified in the Official Gazette and also on Departmental website at least one month in advance.

(3) The syllabus for the examination shall be as per Annexure appended to these rules.

(4) Text books of the Acts and the Rules related to Paper I to Paper III shall be allowed at the examination.

3. *Eligibility for examination.*— Every officer on probation in the said Cadre, whether promotees or direct recruits, shall be eligible to appear for the examination.

4. *Procedure for holding examination.*— The Goa Public Service Commission and GIPARD shall conduct the examination.

5. *Qualifying marks for examination.*— A candidate shall be declared passed in the examination, held under the rule 2, if he secures a minimum of 45% of the maximum marks in each papers provided that if a candidate passes in one or more papers as laid down under rule 2 by securing the minimum marks specified in one or more papers, he shall be exempted from further appearing for examination in the paper in which he has so passed.

6. *Exemption from examination.*— The Government of Goa, subject to such conditions which may be imposed, may exempt any officers from appearing in all or any of the papers included in the Annexure of these rules.

7. *Interpretation.*— If any difficulty arises in interpretation of any of the provision of these rules, the decision of the Government of Goa in this regards shall be final.

The Goa Online Lotteries shall not be sold in the States and Union Territories which do

not permit such sale of lottery and/or declare as "Lottery Free Zone".

Whereas, the Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") received an application dated 19-10-2019 from M/s. Adwalpalkar Constructions & Resorts Pvt. Ltd., for setting up of a new ready mix concrete manufacturing unit in the area as specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the "said area") which is its privately owned land (hereinafter referred to as the "said Project");

And whereas, the Board granted in-principle approval for the said Project and recommended to the Government to declare the said area to be an Investment Promotion Area;

And whereas, the Government accepted the said recommendation of the Board and vide Proclamation No. 3/17/2021-IND/413 dated 30-11-2021, published in the Official Gazette, Series I No. 37 dated 09-12-2021 and in local newspaper viz. "Goan Varta" dated 10-12-2021 (hereinafter referred to as the "said Proclamation") the Government proposed to,-

(a) declare the said area to be an Investment Promotion Area in terms of clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 42 of the Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation of Single Window Clearance Act, 2021 (Goa Act 19 of 2021) (hereinafter referred to as the "said Act");

(b) appoint the Chief Executive Officer, Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation

Board, for the purpose of the assessment and recovery of house tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues as per the provisions of law in force, in terms of clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 42 of the said Act;

(c) declare that the provisions of any State law relating to local authorities providing for control or erection of buildings, levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues to the local authority which is in force in the said area shall cease to apply and thereupon such provisions shall cease to apply thereof and that the Municipal Corporation or the Municipality or the Village Panchayat which were receiving house tax, other taxes or fees from the occupants in the said area under their respective laws, shall be compensated by the Government to the extent of the last financial year's collection of such house tax, other taxes or fees for a period of five years in terms of clause (c) of sub-section (1) of section 42 of the said Act;

(d) authorize the Chief Executive Officer of the Board for the purpose of exercising all the powers, such as, levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues in respect of local authorities which are in force in the said area, in terms of clauses (b) and (d) of sub-section (1) of section 42 of the said Act. House tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues so collected by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board in respect of the said area, shall be deposited with the Government immediately by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board after such collection under Budget Head:-

0851 — Village and Small Industries;

101 — Industrial Estates;

02 — Collection of House Tax from the occupants in the Industrial Estates; and

(e) authorize the Planning, Development and Construction Committee appointed under sub-section (1) of section 43 of the said Act, for exercising all the powers, such as control or erection of building, etc.

(hereinafter collectively called the “said proposal”) and invited all persons who entertain any objections to the said proposal to submit the same in writing with reasons therefor to the Director of Industries, Trade and Commerce, Government of Goa, Panaji, Goa, within a period of one month from the date of publication of said Proclamation in the Official Gazette;

And whereas, the said Official Gazette was made available to the public on 09-12-2021.

And whereas, no objections are received by the Director of Industries, Trade and Commerce, Government of Goa, Panaji, Goa on the said proposal within the said period.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 42 of the Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation of Single Window Clearance Act, 2021 (Goa Act 19 of 2021), the Government of Goa hereby,-

(a) declares whole of the said area as specified in the Schedule hereto to be an Investment Promotion Area;

(b) appoints the Chief Executive Officer of the Board for the purpose of the assessment and recovery of house tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues imposed as per the provisions of law in force;

(c) declares that the provisions of any State law relating to local authorities providing for control or erection of buildings, levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues to the local authority which is in force in the said area shall cease to apply and that the Municipal Corporation or the Municipal Council or the Village Panchayat which were receiving house tax, other taxes or fees from the occupants in the said area under their respective laws, shall be compensated by the Government to the extent of the last financial year's collection of such house tax, other taxes or fees for a period of five years;

(d) authorizes the Chief Executive Officer of the Board for the purpose of exercising

all the powers, such as levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues in respect of local authorities which are in force in the said area. House tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues so collected in respect of said area, shall be deposited with the Government immediately by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board after such collection under the Budget Head:-

0851 — Village and Small Industries;

101 — Industrial Estates;

02 — Collection of House Tax from the occupants in the Industrial Estates; and

(e) authorizes the Planning, Development and Construction Committee appointed under sub-section (1) of section 43 of the said Act, for exercising all the powers, such as control or erection of building, etc. in the said area.

The following Scheme is approved by the Government of Goa and has to be published for the General Information of public and shall come into force from date of publication in the Official Gazette.

“Scheme for providing Counseling to the trainees in all Government Industrial Training Institutes (ITI’s) under Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship”

1. *Introduction.*— Lack of counseling to trainees of Government ITIs has become a reason for many young trainees to become victim to disrupt their career and personal lives. Youth remains in nervous state of mind, confused mind, depression, mental stress due to hectic lifestyles, tough deadlines, multitasking, rat race, cut-throat competition which makes the youth unstable. They even lack confidence to face the life and make proper career.

The diverse socio-economic and cultural levels of the trainees and the increased expectations from parents for achieving higher academic grading plays havoc with the young minds more so with the vulnerable sections of the society thereby falling prey to addictions of alcohol, tobacco and at times gambling. The fear of failure also makes the mind lose self-confidence and leads to psychological imbalances and leading to incidents of committing suicides-amongst the susceptible youth.

This Department is having 10 Industrial Training Institutes (ITI) all over the State which impart training in Engineering and Non-engineering trades for approximately 5000 trainees in a year. Most of these trainees are coming from weaker section of society having socio-economic challenges. The Government of Goa therefore with thoughtful concern endeavors to take due care and as an immediate response desires to engage

expert counselors in ITIs to help the young trainee/cope up with the emotional and psychological stress.

2. *Short title and commencement.*— (I) This scheme shall be called “The Scheme for providing Counseling to the trainees of Government Industrial Training Institutes (ITI’s) at Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship”

(II) This scheme will be implemented through Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship to provide counselling to the required trainees from the eligible Counselors (5 Nos.), Supervisor (1 No.) and Data Entry Operator (1 No.) will be provided by the Government.

3. *Objectives.*— The objective of the scheme is to spot the trainees of ITIs undergoing mental, physical related stress and provide solace, safe vent to release their stress, anguish, grievances, guilt or feeling of unrest/complain of neglect, confidential space through specialized Counselors in a supportive and purposeful manner and assist the distressed student to think more clearly and positively and develop the skills to find their way forward.

The main objective of this scheme is to provide youth friendly counseling services in Government ITIs, to be delivered by appointed Counselors.

3.1 The specific objectives of this scheme are:-

i. To recruit Counselors with specific skills as per qualification criteria mentioned in clause 5.

ii. To recruit Supervisor to provide supervision to the Counselors.

iii. To recruit Data Entry Operator who will computerize the counseling reports and prepare MIS reports and other works related to counselling.

iv. To implement a model of continuing supervision and support of the trained ITI Counselors in the ITIs through supervision and mentoring of Supervisors.

4. *Scope.*— The scheme shall cover the trainees studying in Government ITIs under Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (DSDE) in the State of Goa.

The Counselors shall discuss and assist the trainees in various arrays of concerns and provide guidance with regards to the issues related to:-

- i. Stress Management.
- ii. Adjusting to ITI environment.
- iii. Life transition and changes.
- iv. Difficulties in family relationship.
- v. Depression.
- vi. Anxiety, Anger.
- vii. Physical, Sexual, Emotional abuse.
- viii. Thoughts of suicide.
- ix. Trauma.
- x. Other feelings that cause discomfort.

5. *Eligibility Criteria.*—

A. Counselor Profile:-

Nature of Employment:— Contract basis for 12 months.

Essential:—

(1) Regular Masters degree in Clinical/ /Counseling Psychology OR MSW (Masters in Social Work) with specialization in medical and psychiatric

OR

Regular Graduation in Psychology (6 units), Social Work, Home Science (HR) from UGC recognized College and Diploma in Guidance and Counseling from recognized Institution.

(2) Minimum 1 year experience in Counseling.

- (3) Knowledge of Konkani.
- (4) 15 years residence certificate.

Desirable:—

(1) Knowledge of Marathi.

Age Limit:- 45

B. Supervisor Profile:-

Nature of Employment:- Contract basis for 12 months.

Essential:—

(1) Regular Masters Degree in Clinical/ /Counseling Psychology or MSW (Masters in Social Work) with specialization in medical and psychiatric.

(2) Diploma in Guidance and Counseling from recognized institution.

(3) Minimum 3 years experience in Counselling.

(4) Experience of conducting training and workshops.

(5) 15 years residence certificate.

(6) Knowledge of Konkani.

Desirable:—

(1) Knowledge of Marathi.

(2) M. Phil/Ph. D. in Psychology.

Age Limit:- 45.

C. Data Entry Operator Profile:-

Nature of Employment:- Contract basis for 12 months.

Essential:—

(1) HSSCE passed from recognized Institution.

(2) Certificate having completed course in Computer for a minimum period of 3 months from recognized Institute.

(3) 15 years residence certificate.

(4) Knowledge of Konkani.

Desirable:—

1. Knowledge of Marathi.

Age Limit:- 45.

6. *Appointment Pattern.*— The appointment of Counselors, Supervisor and Data Entry Operator will be on contract basis for a period of 12 months. The Department shall constitute a Committee for the purpose for selection of Counselors, Supervisor and Data Entry Operator. The Committee shall conduct walk-in interviews. DSDE may renew the contract strictly based on the performance of the counselor/supervisor/Data Entry Operators which will be assessed by this committee.

7. *Funding Pattern.*— The Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship will pay the remuneration of the Counselors, Supervisor and Data Entry Operator from the funds provided by State Government or by Government of India through any Centrally Sponsored Schemes, to the tune of Rs. 28,000/-, Rs. 35,000/- and Rs. 20,000/- respectively.

8. *Monitoring & Evaluation.*—

8.1 Plan for Integrating the Initiative within the ITI System.

The ITI is a system where the focus is on holistic development of a trainee instead of focusing only on academic outcomes. To integrate this initiative within the ITI system, it is proposed to plan to optimize existing resources in the following ways:-

(i) *Structural:* The Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship will serve as the main office for the Counselor. These ITIs will provide ideal conditions for achieving the purpose of counseling as they are specifically equipped to cater to this need.

(ii) *Human Resources:* The Counselor is an important human resource within the ITI set up to cater to the needs of emotional well being of students. Through training and supervision, the Counselors capacities will be enhanced to provide efficient and effective counseling for the trainees.

(iii) *Stakeholders:* This program will simultaneously work with consultation with the various stake holders such as Vocational Instructors, Trainees, parents & ITI staff etc. to generate awareness about the program.

(iv) *Secondary Referral centers:* The Counselors will work with the Principals of ITIs and Officers of DSDE to network with secondary referral centers for counseling within the region. These secondary referral centers will need to be recognized by the DSDE. This will lead to the sustainability of this programme.

9. *Relaxation.*— (a) The Government shall be empowered to relax any or all clauses or conditions of the scheme in genuine cases for which the reasons shall be recorded in writing.

(b) If any question arises regarding interpretation of any clause, word, expression, the decision about the interpretation shall lie with the Government which shall be final and binding on all concerned.
