The following bill which was introduced in the Legislative Assembly of the State of Goa on 7th February, 2025 is hereby published for general information in pursuance of Rule-138 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business of the Goa Legislative Assembly.

The Goa Appropriation Bill, 2025

(Bill No. 1 of 2025)

A

BILL

to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the

Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa for the services and purposes of the financial year 2024-25.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Goa in the Seventy-sixth Year of the Republic of India, as follows:—

1. *Short title.*— This Act may be called the Goa Appropriation Act, 2025.

2. *Issue of Rs. 1039,42,16,000/- out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa for the financial year 2024-25.*— From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column (5) of the Schedule hereto amounting in the aggregate to the sums of one thousand thirty nine crore forty two lakh sixteen thousand rupees towards defraying the several charges which will come in the course of payment during the financial year 2024-25 in respect of the services and for purposes specified in column (2) of the said Schedule.

3. *Appropriation.*— The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa under this Act, shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the said Schedule to this Act in relation to the said financial year.

Whereas, the Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") received an application dated 14-10-2020 and 24-05-2024 from M/s. World Peace University for setting up of a Private University to offer wide range of courses on Engineering, Marine Engineering, Medical Science, Management Studies, Arts,

Journalism, Public Policy, etc. in the areas as specified in the Schedules hereto (hereinafter referred to as the "said area") which is leased from the Comunidade of Thivim (hereinafter referred to as the "said Project");

And whereas, the Board granted in-principle approval for the said Project and recommended to the Government to declare the said area to be an Investment Promotion Area;

And whereas, the Government accepted the said recommendation of the Board and vide Proclamation No. 3/16/2024-IND/252 dated 22-08-2024, published in the Official Gazette, Series I No. 22 dated 29-08-2024 and in local newspaper viz. "Tarun Bharat" and "The Navhind Times" dated 04-10-2024 (hereinafter referred to as the "said Proclamation") the Government proposed to,—

(a) declare the said area to be an Investment Promotion Area in terms of clause (a) of sub-section (1) of Section 42 of the Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation of Single Window Clearance Act, 2021 (Goa Act 19 of 2021) (hereinafter referred to as the "said Act");

(b) appoint the Chief Executive Officer, Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation Board, for the purpose of the assessment and recovery of house tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues as per the provisions of law in force, in terms of clause (b) of sub-section (1) of Section 42 of the said Act;

(c) declare that the provisions of any State law relating to local authorities providing for control or erection of buildings, levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues to the local authority which is in force in the said area shall cease to apply and thereupon such provisions shall cease to apply thereof and that the Municipal Corporation or the Municipality or the Village Panchayat which were receiving house tax, other taxes or fees from the occupants in the said area under their respective laws, shall be compensated by the Government to the extent of the last financial year's collection of such house tax, other taxes or fees for a period of five years

in terms of clause (c) of sub-section (1) of Section 42 of the said Act;

(d) authorize the Chief Executive Officer of the Board for the purpose of exercising all the powers, such as, levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues in respect of local authorities which are in force in the said area, in term of clauses (b) and (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 42 of the said Act. House tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues so collected by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board in respect of said area, shall be deposited with the Government immediately by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board after such collection under Budget Head:-

0851 — Village and Small Industries;

00 —

101 — Industrial Estates;

03-00 — Goa Investment Promotion Board—
Conversion Sanad Fees;

04-00 — Goa Investment Promotion Board—
Infrastructure Tax;

05-00 — Goa Investment Promotion Board—

(e) authorize the Planning, Development and Construction Committee appointed under sub-section (1) of Section 43 of the said Act, for exercising all the powers, such as control or erection of building, etc.

(hereinafter collectively called the “said proposal”) and invited all persons who entertain any objections to the said proposal to submit the same in writing with reasons therefor to the Director of Industries, Trade and Commerce, Government of Goa, Panaji, Goa, within a period of one month from the date of publication of said Proclamation in the Official Gazette;

And whereas, the said Official Gazette was made available to the public on 29-08-2024;

And whereas, objections received in this regard have been considered by the Government under sub-section (3) of Section 42 of the said Act and the Government is of

the opinion that the said objections are insufficient and invalid.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of Section 42 of the Goa Investment Promotion and Facilitation of Single Window Clearance Act, 2021 (Goa Act 19 of 2021), the Government of Goa hereby,—

(a) declares whole of the said area as specified in the Schedules hereto to be an Investment Promotion Area;

(b) appoints the Chief Executive Officer of the Board for the purpose of the assessment and recovery of house tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues imposed as per the provisions of law in force;

(c) declares that the provisions of any State law relating to local authorities providing for control or erection of buildings, levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues to the local authority which is in force in the said area shall cease to apply and that the Municipal Corporation or the Municipal Council or the Village Panchayat which were receiving house tax, other taxes or fees from the occupants in the said area under their respective laws, shall be compensated by the Government to the extent of the last financial year's collection of such house tax, other taxes or fees for a period of five years;

(d) authorizes the Chief Executive Officer of the Board for the purpose of exercising all the powers, such as levy and collection of taxes, fees and other dues in respect of local authorities which are in force in the said area. House tax, other taxes, fees and all other types of dues so collected in respect of said area, shall be deposited with the Government immediately by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board after such collection under the Budget Head:-

The Government of Goa is hereby pleased to make the following rules ("Appointment to the posts of Senior Resident in the Goa Dental College and Hospital"), namely:—

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (a) These rules may be called the Goa (Appointment to the posts of Senior Resident in Goa Dental College) Rules, 2024.

(b) They shall apply to all appointments of Senior Residents in the Goa Dental College and Hospital.

(c) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Applications for the posts of Senior Residents shall be invited by advertisement as and when any vacancy arises.

3. *The Departmental Selection Committee.*— There shall be a Departmental Selection Committee consisting of the following officers, namely:—

- i) Dean, Goa Dental College - Chairperson.
- ii) Head of the Department - Member. in the concerned Specialty
- iii) Under Secretary (Health-II), - Member. Public Health Department

4. *Eligibility for the post of Senior Resident.*—

a) *Essential:*

Every candidate applying for the post of Senior Resident shall possess:

- i) BDS Degree.
- ii) MDS Degree in the concerned Specialty.
- iii) Registered with Goa State Dental Council/Any other State Dental Council.
- iv) Knowledge of Konkani.

b) *Desirable:*

- i) Knowledge of Marathi.

5. *Preferences.*— While selecting candidates for appointment to the post of Senior Residents, preference shall be given in the following order:—

a) Candidates who have graduated from the Goa Dental College and Hospital (Under Graduate & Post Graduate) and have satisfactorily completed Bond service at Goa Dental College and Hospital. If such candidates are not available then;

b) Candidates who have graduated from recognized Colleges other than the Goa Dental College and Hospital but who have done the Post Graduation in the Goa Dental College and Hospital. If such candidates are not available, then;

c) Candidates who have graduated from the Goa Dental College and Hospital but have done the Post Graduation in a recognized college other than the Goa Dental College and Hospital. If such candidates are not available, then;

d) Candidates who have graduated and obtained Post Graduation from recognized college other than the Goa Dental College and Hospital.

6. *General Conditions.*— a) The tenure of Senior Residents will be for a period of 3 years and they will be treated as temporary Government Servants (Group 'C') and governed by the C.C.S. (Temporary Service) Rules, 1965;

b) Ordinarily, no extension beyond the tenure period of 3 years shall be granted to the Senior Resident. However, under special circumstances, the appointing authority may consider grant of extension for a period of one month at a time subject to a maximum of 3 months or till alternate arrangement is made to fill the post, whichever is earlier;

c) The appointment shall be subject to medical fitness to be certified by the Authorised Medical Officer.

d) The selected Senior Resident will be eligible for emoluments as sanctioned by Government from time to time.

e) The official shall be entitled for the following types of leave only, namely, Earned leave 15 days for every six months, Commuted leave 10 days for every six months, Casual leave 8 days per year, as admissible under CCS (Leave) Rules, 1972.

f) The female Senior Resident may be granted paid Maternity Leave for a maximum period of 180 days. The period of Maternity Leave cannot be compensated after the tenure of the post.

g) The male Senior Resident shall be eligible for 15 days Paternity Leave.

h) The official shall not be entitled to the benefit of Contributory Provident Fund (CPF) and for any other additional benefits which

are applicable/admissible to the Government servants, such as vacation, LTC and Encashment of Earned Leave.

i) If any false information comes to notice at any time during the service of Senior Resident, his/her services would be liable to be terminated.

j) Candidates who have completed 3 years of senior residency are not eligible for re-appointment.

k) The age limit should not exceed 45 years.

7. The eligible candidates will be called for an Oral interview and shall not be entitled for any TA/DA for appearing for the interview.

8. *Agreement.*— The selected candidates shall be allowed to join subject to a written agreement with Goa Dental College and Hospital to serve for a maximum period of 3 years.

**The Scheme for Shelter Homes
for Women (SHW)**

The Government is pleased to amend the Scheme Shelter Home for Women (SHW) 2006 as under:-

The scheme for SHW extends temporary shelter and rehabilitation to those women who have no social support systems due to family problems, mental strains, social ostracism, exploitation and other causes. It creates a space for women to socially and economically equip themselves to face the challenges. The services extended in these homes include medical care, psychiatric treatment, case work services, occupational therapy, education cum vocational training recreational facilities, etc.

Objectives:—

- To provide temporary shelter and support to women who have no family or social support systems to rely on.
- To rehabilitate the women socially and economically by provision of skill training, counseling.

Implementing Agencies:— Non-Government Voluntary Organization, registered under the Registration of Societies Act, 1860, a public Trust registered under any law for the time being in force, local bodies, Government bodies or other bodies as specified by the Government.

Project Sanctioning Authority:— The Secretary (Women & Child Dev.), Government

of Goa, after considering the proposal submitted by the Director, Women & Child Development may sanction the grant under this Scheme.

Target Group/Beneficiaries:—

- Those who are being forced into prostitution.
- Those who, as a result of family tension or discord, are made to leave their homes without any means of subsistence and have no social protection from exploitation and/or facing litigation on account of marital disputes.
- Those who have been sexually assaulted and are facing the problem of re-adjustment in the family or society.
- Victims of mental maladjustment, emotional disturbances and social ostracism.
- Woman who is subjected to any act of domestic violence.
- Those who escape from their homes due to family problems, mental/physical treatment and counseling for their rehabilitation and re-adjustment in family/society.
- Children accompanying the mother or born in the Institution may be permitted to stay in the Home only up to the age of 7 years, after which they may be transferred to Children's Institutions or provided foster care facilities.

- (vi) To link other schemes with these Homes.

Tasks to be performed by this Committee are:— (i) To ensure smooth functioning of Shelter Homes receiving grants under the scheme, identifying gaps and suggesting steps that would lead to their better functioning.

(ii) The committee shall meet at least once in a quarter.

It should be ensured that at least two members of the District Level Monitoring Committee shall be women. Each implementing agency will submit the Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) of Shelter Home for Women, list of Rehabilitated Women and list of inmates etc. in the prescribed format to the District Level Monitoring Committee.

Eligibility conditions:—

- The organization should have a properly constituted Managing Body with its powers, duties and responsibilities clearly defined and laid down in written.
- The organization should have been registered under some enactment.
- The organization should have experience of working in the field of women and child welfare or related area or should show evidence of competence to take up the proposed scheme.
- Its financial position should be sound.
- It should have facilities resources, experience and personnel to initiate the scheme for which assistance is sought.
- It should not be run for profit to any individual or body of individuals.
- Its services should be open to all without distinction of caste, religion or language.

Other conditions:—

- The organization shall utilize the grant for the purpose for which it is granted.
- The sanctioning authority may sanction the grant at one time or in installments depending upon the credibility of the organization.
- The needy women including those affected by violence along with their children (girls of all ages and boys upto 12 years of age) has to be referred to the State run One Stop Centers (OSCs). The admissibility of any woman for shelter requirements (more than 5 days),

arrangements will be made by OSCs in coordination with the Shelter Homes availing grant-in-aid under the Shelter Home for Women Scheme, till the setting up of the Swadhar Greh under Centrally Sponsored Mission Shakti Scheme. Once the Swadhar Greh is set up, OSCs may decide regarding the admissibility of any woman for shelter requirements in Swadhar Greh or Shelter Homes availing grant-in-aid under the Shelter Home for Women Scheme.

- The Home and its record shall be open for inspection to be conducted by the Government.
- Sanctioning of recurring grant subsequent year/installment depends upon the proper utilization of grant sanctioned earlier.
- The organization will not receive a grant from any other source for the same purpose and activity. However, there would be no objection if funds for the additional beneficiaries or supportive services are obtained from some other source.
- The organization shall submit monthly reports of the No. of inmates (present on the 1st of the month), No. of new inmates admitted, No. of inmates deceased, No. of inmates shifted to hospitals, No. of inmates shifted to other shelter homes, No. of inmates taken by family or relatives at their place, No. of inmates who have escaped (ran away) from the home and No. of inmates released from the home alongwith the copy of the attendance register of the inmates of the particular month.
